# Wildlife Around Sildehøjgaard, Jyllinge



This document contains short descriptions and photos of birds and animals that you might see on Sildehøjgaard in Jyllinge and at most 10 min. walking distance away from the path along the fjord.

The few photos that have not been taken by me are marked by an olive-green border.

I have taken the majority of the photos in this document. My photos do not have a border. They have been taken either from the garden or from the trail following the shoreline 400m towards the marina, along the outer pier and back along the path following the coastline past our lawn to 200m south of our property. I walk this route every day with my dogs. Few photos have been taken before April 2021.

Highlighted yellow text are comments specific to my photos.

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Birds marked with an \* in front of the name and green background are listed in the European Environment Agency's list of protected species for Roskilde Fjord classified under the Birds Directive.

Roskilde Fjord is an EU Special Protection Area and an EU Habitat Area. It is 14,810 ha., of which 71% is maritime.

The designation of hunting- and disturbance-free areas is a result of Roskilde Fjord's status as a Special Protection Area. An area is considered to be of international importance for a species if more than 1% of its northwestern European population regularly spends time there. The following species are in this category: *Mute swan* (3.5%), *greylag goose* (1%), *Tufted duck* (5.8%), *common Goldeneye* (1.8%), *common merganser* (3.2%), *Coot* (1.1%), and *Whooper swan* (1.5%).

4-5,000 birds breed on the small islets in Roskilde Fjord during the breeding season made up of 25-30 waterfowl species dominated by gulls, terns and Mute swans.

Outside the breeding season the area attracts 30-60,000 roosting and foraging birds and during some winters even more.

For the sake of nesting birds it is prohibited to enter the small islets in Roskilde Fjord as well as the South-Eastern part of the island Eskilsø during the bird's breeding season from April 1<sup>st</sup> to July 15<sup>th</sup>. This includes traffic (e.g. rowing / sailing) within a 50-meter zone around Eskilsø and the islets.





# Towards the Fjord, Eskilsø (8-900m) and Østskoven in Hornsherred(2 km)

I was some 100 m from the beach when I took the photo with 24mm wide angle.

The distance from the shoreline to Eskilsø in the background is 800 m. Sildehøjrevet (Herring Reef - the stone reef) extends 400 m into the fjord before turning north-west. Just west of the northern part of the reef is Silderenden, where the Viking ships sailed 900-1,300 years ago when going to and from Roskilde 12 km to the south. The photo was taken on a day with low water in the fjord. The majority of the year the reef is completely covered with water.

To the left of the lawn towards the fjord is a large blackberry bush, where many photos of songbirds in this document have been taken.

From the reed forest and left (south) bordering the lawn is a few meter wide narrow beach meadow with meter tall *Lådden Dueurt (Epilobium Hirsutum) – Greater Willowherb –Zottiges Weidenröschen*. We have only a few spots with a sandy beach, the rest is made up of small stones and boulders on a sandy bottom.

To the right in the photo at the end of the lawn is the start of a reed forest that extends 500m north to Jyllinge Marina. Here I have many times this summer listened to and photographed Reed warblers. Furthermore, most of the year large flocks of Coots might be swimming close to the reeds.



Small population breeds in Roskilde Fjord.

The majority of greylag geese spend their summer in Northern Sweden and the winter in Holland and southern Spain. However, quite a few overwinter in Denmark.



Some 20,000 greylag geese are seen around Roskilde Fjord in the months August-September and roughly half as many during the winter months December-February.

#### 2021-07-28 09:01:

The first Greylag geese arrives to Roskilde Fjord from Northern Sweden every year towards the end of July.

# Terns



<u>\*Dværgterne</u> (Sternula albifrons) | Little tern | Zwergseeschwalbe | Sterne naine

Wingspan: 48-55 cm Length: 24 cm [yellow bean with black tip] Weight: 50-65 g

Not seen on Roskilde Fjord for more than twenty years. At its peak 30 breeding pairs on Lilleø and the south-eastern part of Eskilsø. Population in Europe decreased because of habitat loss, pollution and human disturbance.

The species is a migratory bird that winters in Western Africa or as far as South Africa.



\*Fjordterne (Sterna hirundo) | Common tern | Flußseeschwalbe | Sterne pierregarin

Wingspan: 82-95 cm Length: 35 cm Weight: 80-150 g

The Common tern arrives to Denmark late April and leaves in August-September for the coasts of Western Africa or even South Africa.

Small population breeds on the small islets of Roskilde Fjord.

Hard to distinguish from the artic tern.

The common tern has an orange/reddish beak with a black tip, rather short side tail feathers, the black top on the head goes directly over in the white feathers of face and under body.



The Arctic tern is a migratory bird that arrives to Denmark in late April and leaves in August. Their migration (like that of the







Common tern) follows the Atlantic coast of Europe, but they go further south and some of them reach Antarctica, a trip of more than 17,000 km !!

## 2021-04-30:

Arctic terns "shot" from our shoreline only two days after my first observation that year – one catching a fish on the fly some 10m from the sitting tern.

The tern on the boulder sat there observing the flying tern for at least 5 min. while the other was fishing. However, the sitting bird never received anything !!






## **Ducks**



The grown-up birds winter in lakes and fjords in Denmark while the young birds migrate to Holland, Belgium and Germany.

During the winter the population on Roskilde Fjord can grow to many thousands.



From late September and through winter, we might have flocks of several hundred Coots outside the reed bed or 200m from our coast on the open water of the <mark>fjord.</mark>

Population of 1,200 eiders breed on the small islets of Roskilde Fjord.


30% of the Northwestern European stock of eiders is wintering in Denmark.

Arrives to the fjord February and leaves when the duckling can fly late July.

Common eider females and chicks can be hard to see when they are swimming far out on the fjord. They are mostly foraging on low water 50-150 m from the coast line. They eat predominantly common mussel.

Wingspan: 55-69 cm Length: 41 cm Weight: male 600-800 g female 500-650 g

The only living member of the genus Mergellus. This genus is closely related to *Mergus* and is sometimes included in it, though it might be closer to the Goldeneyes (*Bucephala*).

2,000-5,000 migrates to Denmark from Finland and Northern Rusland. The total NorthWest and Central Eurepean population estimated at 28.000–41.000 birds.

The White-tailed eagle is the largest bird of prey in Northern Europe. Among Danish ornithologists nicknamed "the flying door" (Danish: *den flyvende dør*).

In the colder months there is a good chance of seeing White-tailed eagles on Roskilde Fjord in the area around Eskilsø and Jyllinge Holme.

Three couples was reported in 2018 breeding at Bognæs north of Roskilde, in Jægerspris Nordskov (on the other side of Eskilsø when seen from our lawn), and respectively in a forest area east of Skibby.



Breeds in neighboring farm buildings.

Hare (Lepus europaeus) | Hare | Feldhase | Lièvre

Head and body length can range from 60 to 75 cm.



Might be seen in the morning or evening on the lawn or on the dirt road.

2021-07-21: Hare running along the border with lawn and the wild plants.



2021-12-11: Hare hiding in the first snow of the winter just south of Snekkevej.





<u>Mosegris/Vandrotte</u> (Arvicola amphibious) | Water vole | Ostschermaus | Vole européenne sur l'eau

Length: 15-20 cm + tail of 5-7 cm

Mammal adapted to a subterranean lifestyle close to slow moving water, e.g. in reed beds.

Mainly vegetarian, feeding primarily on succulent vegetation. During winter on roots, bulbs, etc.



Muldvap (Talpa europaea) | Mole | Maulwurf | Môle

Length: 12-16 cm

Mammal adapted to a subterranean lifestyle. Feeds mainly on worms.

Not seen in very sandy earth or areas where the water table is very close to the surface.

Disrupts the lawn mainly late summer through winter.



<u>Rådyr</u> (Capreolus capreolus) | Roe deer | Reh | Chevreuil

Length: 0,9 to 1,3 m Sholder height of 60–90 cm.

Not seen so often and mainly in the morning/evening/night close to the reeds or in the bushes.



<u>Ræv</u> (*Vulpes vulpes*) | Red fox | Fuchs | Renard Length: approx. 70 cm plus a tail of 40 cm

2021-05-06: Fox under our weeping willow an early afternoon. More often seen in the garden evening/night.

# Some of the Fish Found in Roskilde Fjord



Blåmusling (Mytilus edulis) | Common mussel | Miesmuschel | Moules marinières

The mussel is the most numerous and biologically important bottom dweller in the fjord and there are dense populations almost everywhere. They are not very big but there are a lot of them.

The volume of water that passes through the fjord's mussel population every day is equivalent to twice the total volume of water in the fjord, but it is of course largely the same water they filter all the time.



Havørred (Clupea haringus) | Heerring | Meerforelle | Truite de mer

The sea trout has become more common in the fjord in recent years. This is due largely to a determined release programme, and to the greater purity of water in the fjord and in streams.



#### Hornfisk (Belone belone) | Garfish | Seestern | Orphie

The garfish come into the fjord to spawn in spring and early summer. At that time of the year anglers swarm around the narrow passages in the fjord, and often have something to take home for dinner. They just happen to come into the fjord when the White-tailed eagles have young, and as these fish are often to be seen near the surface of the water they are easy prey for the eagles, which often use them to feed their young.



Sild (Clupea haringus) | Sea trout | Hering | Haring

Herring take second place, by weight, in both the northern and southern parts of the fjord. Herring fishing in the fjord is not very important.


<u>Vandmand</u> (Aurelia aurita) | Moon jellyfish | Mondquallen | Méduse lunaire

In recent years there has been a rapid increase in the jellyfish population in the fjord. They live independently of one another, but they often gather in dense shoals. They live on zooplankton and fry but are not themselves eaten by other species and are therefore at the top of the food chain.



Østers (Ostrea edulis) | Oyster | Auster | Huître

There are no oysters in Roskilde Fjord nowadays but in the Stone Age, 7-8,000 years ago, there were big oyster beds at narrow points in the fjord. These beds now form sizeable layers of oyster shells, up to more than 10 metres in depth. They are in the narrows by Frederikssund, by Kølholm, and on the west coast of the fjord from Jyllinge Holme to Selsø Hage, and a few other places.
